- Raised \$180,000 out of cycle in 2015, and \$250,000 in cycle in 2018
- Created a new model for producing a national new play festival by rallying a producing coalition that included the LTC, Goodman Theatre, Steppenwolf Theatre, Victory Gardens, the Theatre School at DePaul University and local Chicago Latinx theatres. The model is fleet and circumvents the mission-needs, red-tape, and infrastructural obligations of any one institution.
- Co-conceived and raised funds for the LTC El Fuego Initiative, an initiative which insured production of each of the twelve Carnaval 2015 playwrights at theatres nationwide by 2020. El Fuego seeded ten world and regional premieres by Carnaval playwrights during the 2016-17 thru 2018-19 seasons.
